Dear Mr. President and Members of the Senate:

We are writing to thank you for passing S2109 to support job pipeline training through the Workforce Competitiveness Trust Fund. We appreciate your unwavering support and advocacy for effective workforce training programs that help people find jobs in diverse industry sectors across Massachusetts.

The Workforce Solutions Group, which includes representatives from the AFL-CIO, workforce professionals, community-based organizations and the Massachusetts Business Roundtable, worked closely with Associated Industries of Massachusetts and legislative leaders on this bill.

We support and applaud the tribute to the late Senator Ken Donnelly, who filed this legislation to help unemployed and underemployed people develop the skills needed to fill open jobs.
