The Roundtable helped organize the **Jobs & Workforce Summit** at Devens that featured Roundtable member Shire as “Employer of the Year” and others including Verizon, People’s United Bank, Eastern Bank and Santander. Before an audience of more than 300 policy makers, business, labor and education leaders, the Summit celebrated successful youth employment, job training and legislative champions for workforce development. Labor & Workforce Development Secretary Rosalin Acosta, Representative Paul Brodeur and other leaders spoke at the event.

MBR was invited to the full **Senate Caucus** to discuss priorities of Roundtable members. Roundtable Executive Committee Member, Jim Tierney, NE Market Director for JLL and MBR Executive Director JD Chesloff highlighted major policy priorities—education, transportation, energy, health care and competitiveness—and engaged in a conversation with close to 30 members of the Senate at the State House.

The report made specific recommendations to stabilize the early education workforce, build quality programs, and create a sustainable system that better meets the needs of children and families across the state. The Roundtable played a leadership role in this effort, which led to significant new investment in the early childhood workforce.

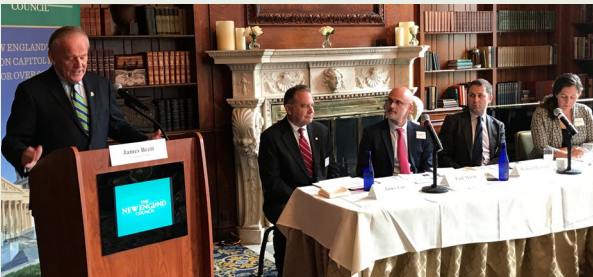
## GLOBAL CONVERSATIONS

The event included speakers from the U.S. Commerce Department, Ex-Im Bank, U.S. Trade and Development Agency and the Overseas Private Investment Corporation.

**Republic of Georgia.** The Roundtable convened a discussion with the Republic of Georgia Ambassador to the U.S., the Honorable David Bakradze and Chief Envoy Giorgi Tsikolia on trade and economic opportunities with senior business and educational leaders. The Ambassador spoke with members about many of the Roundtable's priorities including STEM education, partnerships with universities to produce skilled workers, health care and globalization.

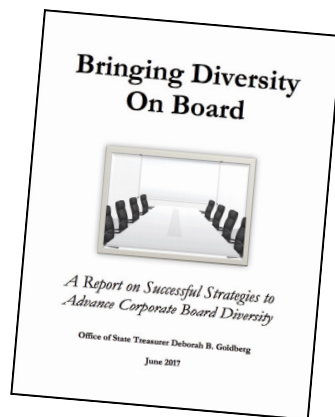

## BOSTON WOMEN'S WORKFORCE COUNCIL

Roundtable Executive Committee member and Co-Chair of the Boston Women's Workforce Council Cathy Minehan presented data on the current wage gap across industries and kicked off the Third Annual "Best Practices Conference" highlighting companies that are addressing the gender gap while advancing pay equity in the workplace. **Boston Mayor Marty Walsh** as well as leaders from some of the state's business groups including the Boston Chamber, the Alliance and MBR participated in the event to focus on closing the wage gap and celebrating companies that have signed the 100% Talent Compact.

## RAISING AWARENESS ABOUT HUMAN TRAFFICKING

The Roundtable joined with Attorney General Maura Healey and Boston Mayor Marty Walsh to help educate business leaders on the issue of human trafficking, its relevance to the workplace and to identify ways for employers to address it. MBR Executive Director JD Chesloff and Jesse Mermell from the Alliance for Business Leadership collaborated on an op-ed in the Boston Business Journal to help the Attorney General and Mayor reach out to the broader business community about this effort. The op-ed included themes consistent with the Roundtable's ongoing work to promote equity, diversity, fairness and safety in the workplace.

### Human sex trafficking is a business issue

The business community gets convened with great frequency. Our organizations, and our peers in this ecosystem, spend a lot of time in the same rooms. Every once in a while, one of these meetings turns your world-view on its head. We recently attended such a meeting.

Last month, Boston Mayor Marty Walsh and Attorney General Maura Healey convened a group of business leaders to discuss a topic neither of us would have considered a business imperative: sex trafficking. A moral imperative, sure. But what does sex trafficking have to do with business? Here's what we learned: According to Businesses Ending Slavery & Trafficking (BEST) — an advocacy group formed to "use the power of business to prevent human trafficking" — the most frequent age of entry into prostitution in Boston is 14 years old. Fourteen.

This isn't something happening somewhere else; it's happening right here in our own backyard. An average

When law enforcement placed decoy ads, they were able to trace 13 percent of responses back to Boston-area businesses. That means that employees may be using company resources—phones or computers—to arrange for paid sex while they're on the clock.

Sex trafficking is a business issue. Local leaders are taking note, and taking action. Boston Mayor Marty Walsh, Attorney General Maura Healey, and Governor Charlie Baker all recently announced anti-human trafficking

es looking to combat sex trafficking:

1. Gain the commitment of executive leadership to engage with the Boston Employer Alliance, being launched later this year;
  2. Complete a confidential online assessment ([www.bestalliance.org/ma-assessment](http://www.bestalliance.org/ma-assessment)); and
  3. Implement best practices prioritized from the self-assessment.
- Nationally, employers are stepping up. Marriott, Carlson (owner of brands such as Radisson and TGI Friday's), Caesar's Entertainment, Skanska, Morgan Stanley, Microsoft, Google and Costco have all taken actions to combat sex trafficking, including raising awareness, supporting programs, donating resources and adopting strong anti-trafficking policies. Here in Massachusetts, the attorney general and the Boston mayor have created a path for businesses to act by conceiving of the BEST Boston Employer Alliance, with a series of events culminating in an official public launch in September, including opportunities for employers

Roundtable's impact on public policy:

- ✦ Advocated successfully for passage of Senate legislation establishing **workforce development pipeline** funding through Commonwealth Corporation.
- ✦ Contributed to the passage of the state's landmark **Renewable Energy** law, competitive procurement for offshore wind and renewable energy development.

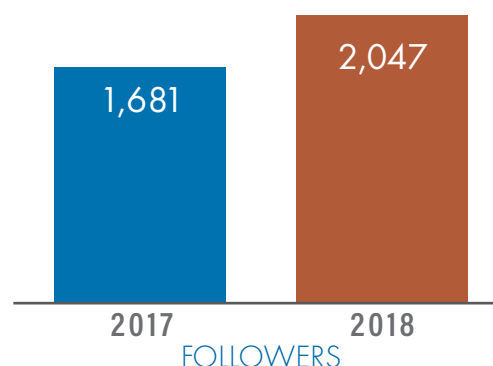

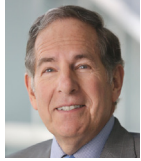
