Earlier this year, Chair Steinmetz championed the expansion of the EY Neuro-Diverse Center of Excellence to Boston, paving career pathways for companies to hire talented neurodivergent individuals, including those with cognitive differences, such as dyslexia, ADHD, autism and Asperger syndrome. Chair Steinmetz is also an advocate for climate change and sustainability, as well as mental health, two additional areas that align with the Roundtable's 2021–2022 Public Policies and Priorities.
